## **ADMINISTRATION**

- The Department Head met with the majority of full-time faculty members (over 100 faculty members).
- In June 2023, the UBC DOM Annual Faculty & Staff Awards Presentation was held virtually on Zoom, to recognize our many outstanding faculty and staff.

The annual Resident Retreat took place on May 17-19 in Whistler. It featured several different didactic topics and panel discussions, with highlights including a featured talk on reflections of 'Elder Statesmen' by Dr. Jake Onrot.

On June 7, the 39th Annual Resident Research Day occurred in-person at the Paetzold Auditorium at VGH and featured residents' podium and poster presentations.

The PGY1 CaRMS Match was a great success, and the core program filled all its IMG, CMG, and Vancouver Island positions in the first iteration.

The first Competency by Design (CBD) cohort of PGY4 residents completed

the program in June 2023 and was the first core year to complete the Transition to Practice phase of training within CBME.

The Global Health Program, led by Dr. Marla McKnight, continued its collaboration with the University of Rwanda through virtual means to provide collaborative educational opportunities. The Global Health elective for PGY2-5s was relaunched in person after being on hold since 2020. Thirteen residents completed the elective in Butare, Rwanda, in partnership with the University of Rwanda between January and June of 2023.

The Year 3 Undergraduate CTU and Ambulatory rotations continued in their traditional six-week and two-week formats, respectively. Hybrid academic sessions continued to be offered, with in-person attendance encouraged at host sites.

Out-of-Province Year 4 Electives for UBC students resumed in July 2023.

A CTU redesign working group was formed to address undergraduate student concerns regarding workload, work hours, and the provision of adequate study time.

The integration of Planetary Health and Geriatrics curriculum content is underway within the CTU and IM Ambulatory rotations, respectively.

## **RESEARCH**

Department of Medicine faculty secured \$70,909,329 in research funding for 1,003 projects in FY2022/3, and published 1,395 peer-reviewed papers.

The Research Office team for 2023 included Dr. Teresa Tsang, Dr. Anna Meredith, Diane Kim, Sharon Xu, and Yusuf Shodeko who joined the team in September 2023. Sophia Gu and Nicole Yeung joined the team as work-learn students in summer 2023.

The 2023 Experimental Medicine Research Expo was held on Friday June 2 at the Paetzold Health Education Centre at Vancouver General Hospital. This was the program's first complete in-person event since the pandemic, and was a huge success in bringing together faculty and students to remind us of the significance of personal interactions in academia and research. The exceptional presentations showcased the remarkable talent and dedication that our students bring to the program. We thoroughly enjoyed the engaging panel discussion and greatly appreciate the insights of our 4 invited panelists, Drs. Chisholm, Griffith, Heinze and Singh. And last, but not least, we are extremely grateful to our fantastic faculty speakers, Drs. Robillard, Görges, Conway and Krebs, who generously shared their research, experience, and time with us at Expo this year. Over 120 students, staff and faculty attended Expo, and 4 trainee oral and 44 trainee poster presentations were featured. Awards were presented to Jamie Kwon (Top Oral Presentation), Iryna Kayla (Honorable Mention Oral Presentation), Liam Mullins (Best Poster - Biomedical), Jialin Han (Best Poster - Clinical), Nance Cunningham (Best Poster - Health Systems), Kelvin Wu (Best Poster - Public and Population Health).

In 2023 the Research Office was successful in securing funding to support the Data Science and Health Research Excellence Cluster further develop its strategic projects in data literacy and health data analytics:

- Grants Catalyzing Research Clusters 2023: Established Cluster funding for Data Science and Health Cluster (2023-2025).
- Ministry of Post-secondary and Future Skills: Microcredential funding for development of the Health Data Analytics microcredential program (launching January 23, 2024).
- CIHR Cafe Scientifique to explore public opinion about using public health data to develop and deploy Artificial Intelligence, this public event will be held on April 25, 2024.
- 2023 Seminar Series Fund for the Joint Clinical-Analytic Rounds Series

- (launched November 25, 2023).
- DASH-DSI-PHSA Data Science training agreement to develop and deliver targeted educational programming tailored to the needs of BC health authorities.

DASH and the Research office developed seminars and workshops addressing key aspects of health data science:

- Al Meets Ethics seminar series commenced this year and featured 4 speakers so far to explore ethical considerations of Al development and deployment for health care applications (April Dr. Charlene Ronquillo, September Dr. Madeline Ransom, October Dr. Wendy Wong). The series will continue in February 2024.
- DASH Joint Clinical-Analytics Rounds was launched in partnership with the UBC Department of Pathology in November 2023. This series aims to create a place for new dialogues and collaboration between the clinical and analytic communities, where clinical experts bring relevant research questions and data, and analytic experts provide ways to derive innovative solutions. The inaugural session featured DASH colleagues from T-CAIREM, Drs. Muhammad Mamdani and Amol Verma share Toronto's experience implementing data analytics and machine learning algorithms in the clinical setting.
- Data Science and Health 2023 Al in Medicine: Rise of the Machines (November 14, 2023) DASH annual conference was hosted in partnership with the UBC Vision Cluster and dove into the fundamental questions of Al in medicine as well as the state-of-the-art applications of Al in medical research. The event featured world-leading guest speakers and cluster members to unpack the ethical, legal, and existential implications of Al, and how it can be leveraged to open new horizons in Al-human interactions.
- All About Privacy was a special workshop featuring BC's regional health authorities to explore each of their research privacy review processes and processes for to access their health data. Featuring in-depth discussions around the current privacy review systems across jurisdictions, common misunderstandings, plans for future improvement, as well as an open Q&A session. Over 200 attendees participated demonstrating the importance of this topic.

DASH expanded its communications activities to highlight the work of our faculty and cluster members by developing a new DASH Spotlight Series and Interview Series featuring DASH trainees.

Conferences and sponsorships:

- DASH participated in the 2023 T-CAIREM AI in Medicine conference and The Data Effect Vancouver - Our Health Data Opportunity Conference.
- DASH sponsored the 2023 MICCAI (International Conference on Medical Image Computing and Computer Assisted Intervention). The 26th International Conference on Medical Image Computing and Computer Assisted Intervention, MICCAI 2023, was held from October 8th to 12nd 2023 in Vancouver Convention Centre Canada. MICCAI attracts the world's leading biomedical scientists, engineers, and clinicians from a wide range of disciplines associated with medical imaging and computer assisted intervention.

Education and data literacy were key areas on focus in 2023:

- MEDI504A/B, developed by the Department of Medicine and DASH was delivered in the 2022-3 and 2023-4 academic years, providing training in machine learning approaches for health research.
- Development of the new Health Data Analytics Microcredential began in the Spring of 2023, with a course launch date of January 23, 2024. The UBC Micro-certificate in Health Data Analytics: Opportunities and Applications is a new program developed by the UBC DASH Cluster and the Data Science Institute for health care professionals and researchers in the health sector with exposure to health data, either clinical or operational. Designed by industry and academic experts, the microcertificate consists of three four-week online courses, combining self-paced independent study with weekly live online sessions.
- DASH supported the rollout of the T-CAIREM Health Data Nexus for UBC faculty, staff and students. This platform is a repository of freelyavailable medical research data, managed by the Temerty Centre for Al Research and Education in Medicine. This safe, scalable and secure data environment provides a foundation for innovative Al applications of the future.

DASH continued to expand its partnerships in 2023, beginning collaborative projects with Popdata BC to improve researcher access to health data in BC, and with Genome BC and the Health Data Platform BC to explore new ways of linking multidimensional data sets to support AI. Our team has also developed a new partnership with the Centre for Excellence in Indigenous Health to better understand the Department of Medicine's existing partnerships with Indigenous communities in BC, and develop new ways to better support this work. The DASH team was involved in the Health Research BC ESHORI

Advisory Committee and the BC Ministry of Health RAPP (Research Approvals Processes Project) initiative, as well as participating as a member of the T-CAIREM Education Committee, UBC-PHSA Health Data Science Working Group, and the T-CAIREM Collaborative Catalyst Grant (with the University of Toronto and University of Manitoba).
